



MESSAGE FROM THE MAYOR

Geraldton's future looks brighter than ever it did. Great plans are being made which give added impetus to us all to obtain the most for our town and district. The very many visitors who mingle with us during the year, and particularly during the Sunshine Festival, tell us that they, too, become infected by the great upsurge of excitement and enthusiasm that surrounds us all.

Why should this be?

Chiefly, because Geraldton is strategically placed for statewide developmental plans that are unfolding. Geraldton has Western Australia's furthest north deep-water port and this is being deepened still more and berth-side facilities improved.

Geraldton is the railhead for pick-a-back road transport for the road system of the north, with the great projects at North West Cape and the Pilbarra already under way. Geraldton's agricultural hinterland is seeking new and wider horizons with increased wheat and wool production, and future plans are being laid to build up a substantial meat export industry. The local crayfish and other fishing enterprises bring great wealth to our shores.

These main economic enterprises are fully backed by a profitable tomato growing industry, considerable mineral exports, expanding building industries based on Geraldton and a developing Tourist Industry which has a glorious future indeed. All these activities promote more transport companies, retail stores, schools, hospitals, recreation grounds and so on. There is no doubt why the people of these parts see a great future ahead for Geraldton.

We welcome all visitors to our Sunshine Festival when they too can learn of our hopes and with us enjoy the revelry of our Annual Carnival.


GERALDTON

Geraldton is the second largest port in Western Australia, serving a vast hinterland. It was not until 1848, when a party under Mr. A. C. Gregory discovered lead deposits 70 miles north of the settlement, that some attention was focussed on this part of the State. The original name given to the settlement was Gerald Town, after the Governor of the day, Sir Charles Fitzgerald. In 1850 the first blocks of land were sold, and from then on a steady expansion of the district took place. Western Australia's first railway line was built in 1879, and it ran from Geraldton to Northampton. This line was closed a few short years ago, but during its lifetime contributed greatly to the development of the rich farming land between the two towns and in the surrounding districts. Geraldton today is the centre for the highly productive Victoria District of some 24,000 square miles, with a population of approximately 25,000. In the immediate town and district of Geraldton there is a population of about 12.500. The rapid growth of population and productivity over the past ten years can readily be seen from the following comparison of figures:-

The wealth of the district is bolstered still further by the production of Tomatoes and Crayfish.

Wharf activity has been increased over recent years and with current harbour deepening and berth extensions, there is every reason to believe this activity will be maintained. The long awaited development of iron ore deposits, a short distance to the east of Geraldton, will be another major step forward for the town and district. All in all, Geraldton's future is quite 'rosy" and an air of optimism rightly exists amongst the inhabitants of this northern area.

The Festival Queen Competition

One of the highlights of the Festival will be the Crowning of the Sunshine Festival Queen at the opening ceremony on Saturday, August 24th, 1963.

The Queen Competition was organised by the Rotary Club of Geraldton on behalf of the Festival Committee. It was open to all unmarried girls of not less than 17 years at the date of judging and who lived within the Town of Geraldton or the Shire Councils of Geraldton-Greenough, Chapman Valley, Irwin, Mullewa or Northampton.

The preliminary judging took place earlier in August and the winner's name will be announced following the official opening ceremony.

The judging was based on appearance, speech, deportment and general knowledge. Thus, it is in no sense a beauty contest. During the judging, the contestants were required to wear only two types of clothing, those being evening and day wear.

Through the courtesy of Mac.Robertson-Miller Airlines Limited the winner will receive a free return air trip to Albany with free accommodation, and will also be the recipient of a presentation sash as a memento of the occasion. The runner-up will be awarded a trophy valued at £10 and also a presentation sash.


