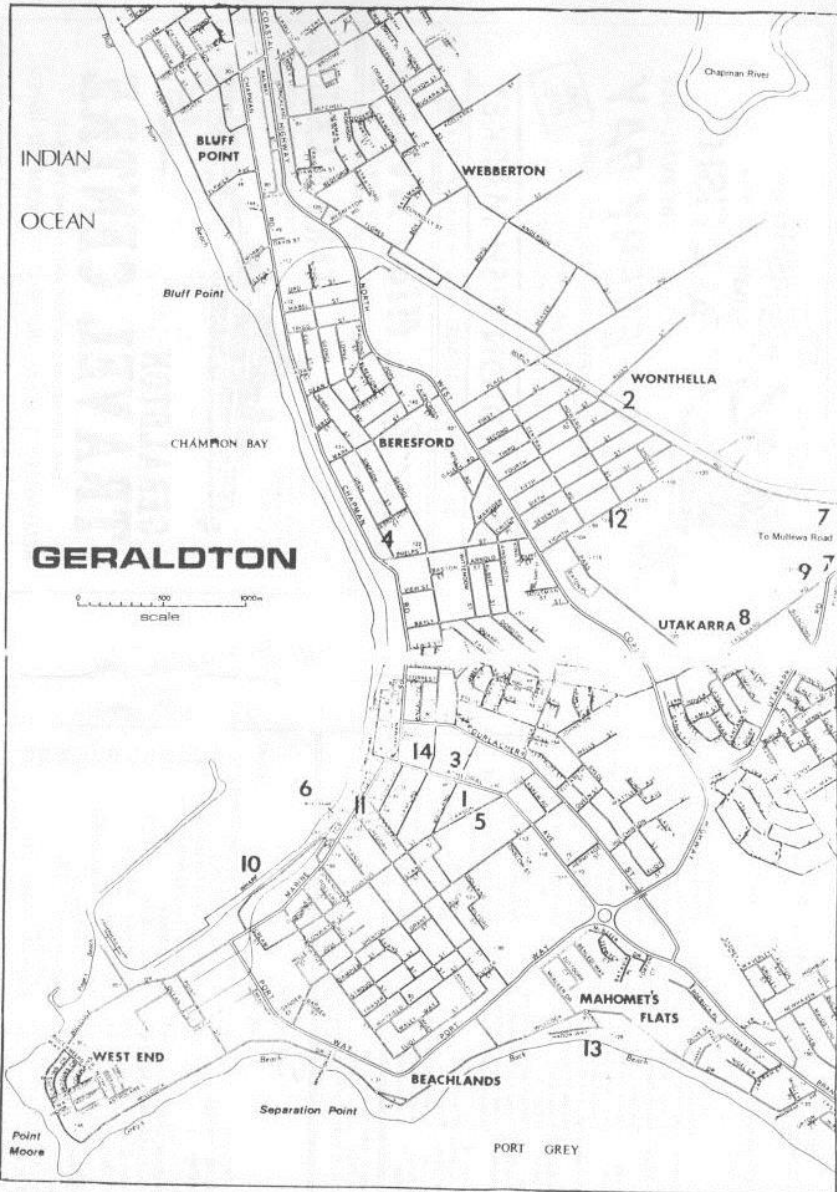

## Festival History

IT ALL BEGAN AS A TOMATO FESTIVAL

The Geraldton Sunshine Festival was first conceived by the Geraldton Retail Traders Association in 1959. The then President of the Association, Mr John Jordan Johnstone came up with an idea to improve trade during the August school holidays. A Tomato Festival was planned, but the name was changed to the 'Geraldton Sunshine Festival' to encompass the whole of the community and not just the tomato growers.

## Geraldton - Greenough History

Just before sunrise on the 4th of June, 1629, the Dutch ship "Batavia" blown off course on a trip to the Dutch East Indies, ran aground on Morning Reef of the Abrolhos Island group, 70 kilometres off the coastline west of Geraldton.

Most of the crew survived and the Commander, Francisco Pelsaert, set sail for Batavia to seek help. In his absence a mutiny occurred and during its course 125 men, women and children were massacred.

Upon Pelsaert's return the mutineers were quickly rounded up, tried and hanged with the exception of two who were set ashore on the mainland near the Murchison River, thus becoming Australia's first European Settlers.

As fate would have it, another shipwreck near the same location over 200 years later, led to the establishment of the Township of Geraldton.

In 1839 as a result of a shipwreck at Gantheume Bay George Grey discovered Champion Bay and the surrounding district. After returning to Perth on foot he reported that he was impressed by the country he had seen and in 1849 the first settlers came to the district.

In 1851 large pastoral leases were let in Greenough and lead and copper mines became operational in the Northampton District. As a result, by the end of 1879 a railway was completed between Geraldton and Northampton.

By the 1880's Geraldton was a prosperous town exporting wool from the Murchison District, copper and lead ore from Northampton and grain from the Hinterlands.

Today the local government areas of Greenough and Geraldton have a combined population of about 25,000 people and the Port is exporting well over a million tonnes of agricultural and mineral produce annually.

## Festival Queen Quest

The Sunshine Festival Queen Quest has been run since the first Festival in 1959.

Four years ago 'Miss Charity' was added and now, there are two major prizes. The 'Festival Queen' wins a 12 day Qantas Jetabout Tour through Europe and \$150 in spending money from the R & I Bank.

The 'Charity Queen' wins a 10 day trip to Singapore courtesy of Qantas Airways and \$150 in spending money from the R & I Bank.

Accommodation is supplied by the Geraldton Travel Centre and travel to and from Perth by M.M.A.

All funds raised will benefit LOCAL charitable organisations.

## Shire of Greenough

Since the settlement of Greenough on the picturesque Greenough Flats in the mid 1800's, the area has proved a fountain of resources and interest.

Now, that settlement is one of the most important historical areas in Western Australia, and under the auspices of the Historical Society.

**GREENOUGH HISTORIC HAMLET:** The hamlet is situated in an area known as the Front Flats, through which the Greenough River passes.

The Flats, themselves, are a unique landscape, most notably dotted with misshapen trees bent over in grotesque form caused by salt laden winds. The sand hills to the west border the ocean and the ridge to the east marks the beginning of a larger area called the Back Flats.

The Greenough Front Flats were surveyed by A.C. Gregory in 1857 and by the end of the following year had been fully occupied in small tillage lots.

Wheat farming began immediately, most of the hard work being done without the aid of machinery. Thus, the story of the Front Flats is one of ordinary men and women who undertook a hard pioneering life.

The hamlet today comprises 11 of the original buildings in perfect condition restored by the National Trust of W.A. Inspection of the hamlet is thoroughly recommended.

**ELLENDALE POOL:** (20km North East of Walkaway) A natural pool in the Greenough River situated at the foot of a sheer rock face. Plenty of shady trees and barbeques - an ideal picnic area.

**GREENOUGH RIVER MOUTH:** Here is a popular beach and picnic area. A bar across the river mouth provides access to both banks of the river. There are many picnic and fishing spots upstream on the river - a visit is recommended.

**WALKAWAY STATION MUSEUM - WALKAWAY:** These buildings were constructed in 1887 and the station remained operational until 1966. Today they house a wide range of items drawn from the district's past. This station was the terminus for the 'Midland Railway Company

**GREENOUGH PIONEER MUSEUM:** This was the home of a district pioneer and was constructed in 1860. Most rooms have been refurnished with furniture and household items of that era.

### FESTIVAL VILLAGE

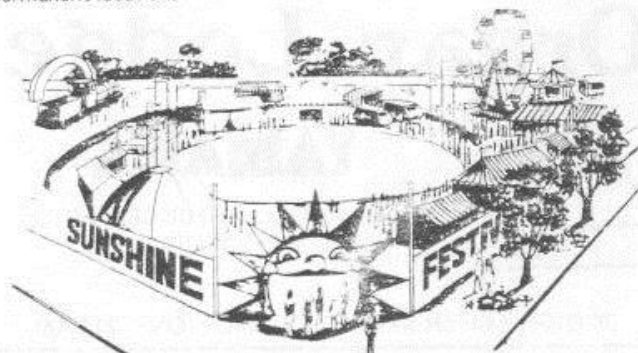
In past years the numerous events that make up our unique entertainment, have been spread over many different venues, some not altogether suitable to the situation.

## Festival in Brief

Colleen was the dominant figure on our 'DONATHON '79' and made many friends and fans in Geraldton.



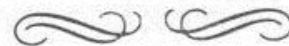

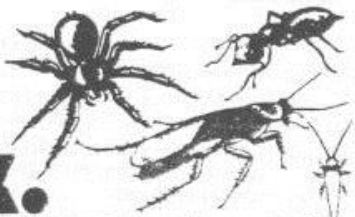

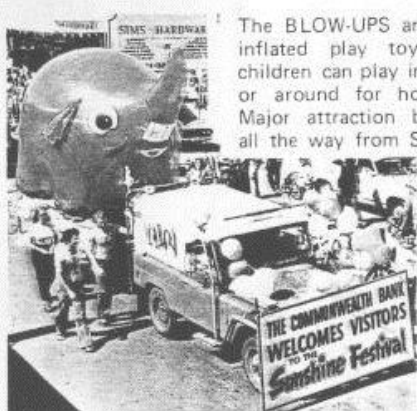


The first day of the Festival - Judging of the Festival Queens - Judging of the Little Miss Sunshine Entrants - the Festival parade through the streets.
